The Paddy O'Brien Collection

Included in this auction are many lots (uniforms and headgear) from the Paddy O'Brien Collection.

Paddy (Paul) O'Brien, 1964 - 2023

Paddy O'Brien was a long-serving Sales Manager at I.S. Wright, well known not only for his professional expertise but also for his larger-than-life personality and deep Irish/Australian roots. A natural storyteller with a fondness for a drink and good company, he left lasting impressions wherever he went. From a young age, he coauthored several works on Australian military history with his father, developing a lifelong passion for the subject. One of their key areas of focus was the Eureka Stockade in Ballarat, a pivotal chapter in Australia's story.

Over decades of working in museums in his youth and with I.S. Wright, Paddy built a remarkable private collection that reflected both his global curiosity and scholarly dedication. While Australian military history was a central focus, his interests extended worldwide, encompassing conflicts from Europe, the Americas, Asia, and Africa. The collection spans eras from the Napoleonic and Prussian periods through the 19th-century Irish uprisings, the American Civil War, and Soviet conflicts, to artefacts and uniforms from many nations involved in the First and Second World Wars.

In addition to his professional and scholarly pursuits, he selflessly volunteered twenty-three years of his life to the State Emergency Service (S.E.S.), where his commitment and courage earned him commendations.

His legacy lives on through the stories his collection tells, the history he helped preserve, and the lives he touched through both his work and his service.

New South Wales Military Forces tunic with green upright collar and cuffs, seven New South Wales Military Forces white metal buttons to centre seam with two to the rear waist. - 6. WW1 Australian 'Women's Khaki Defence Corps the Khaki Girls' uniform blouse, skirt, underclothing, boots, water bottle and haversack. Two pocket khaki heavy cotton female's blouse with three brass KC buttons to centre seam, red

piping to epaulettes with KC brass buttons, cloth waist belt with brass buckle and cloth bayonet frog. Unlined with padded shoulders named H. Talbot.; khaki unlined skirt with button and eyelet fasteners on side, waist to ankle style.: rough white cotton frock (possibly worn as a skirt cover) heavily stained.; female white cotton underclothing (2 piece).; brown female high lace-up boots. All are slim petite size, overall, very good condition for age.; khaki cotton haversack with leather re-enforced edges.; enamelled dark blue/black water bottle with light khaki cotton cover, 'Burgess' printed to the bottom, with leather suspension strap. The 'Women's Khaki Defence Corps/Khaki Girls/Defence Girls' were a semi-official group of female employees of the Commonwealth Government Clothing Factory Melbourne, who were raised in 1917/1918. There were approximately 200 women who served in the unit. They formed a bugle band, a rifle squad, a physical culture squad, girls football team and a dancing squad. The organisation did charity work raising funds, giving concerts and entertainment, and taking part in patriotic functions.

Two pocket dark khaki cotton female's blouse with three brass KC buttons to centre seam, red piping to epaulettes with KC brass buttons, cloth waist belt with brass buckle and cloth bayonet frog. Unlined with padded shoulders. Displaying 1915 vintage Australian Comforts Fund badge to left breast pocket.; khaki unlined skirt with button and eyelet fasteners on side, waist to ankle style. WW1 WW2 vintage Australian officer's trench coat.** Two pocket tan coloured heavy canvas calf length coat with cuffs and hem edged with leather, six Bakelite Australian Military Forces buttons to double breasted centre seam. Four pocket khaki short sleeved heavy cotton jacket with four gilt G.O. buttons to centre seam, lapels, pockets and shoulder boards. Displaying 'Red Tabs' on collar lapels (small mothing). Lieutenant general's rank embroidered shoulder boards. Double ribbon bar displaying Companion of the Order of St Michael and St George, Distinguished Service Order, 1914 – 15 Star, War Medal, Victory Medal, with MID (being five times awarded) device affixed, Jubilee Medal (1935), Coronation Medal (1937), Order of Saint Stanislaus, 3rd Class with Swords, affixed to left breast. Cloth waist belt present with gilt metal buckle. Unlined with no labels etc. Well-worn but in good condition. Four pocket khaki heavy cotton long trousers with Bakelite buttons. No labels, waist 80cm approx. The trousers are unused and near new condition and comes with a second set of cloth ribbon bars and spare general officer buttons. CN1. Est \$500 to \$700

Lieutenant General Charles George Norman Miles, C.M.G., D.S.O. was Commandant of the Royal Military College, Duntroon from 1935 to 1939 and Adjutant General from 1939 to 1940, before succeeding Lieutenant General Vernon Sturdee as General Officer Commanding Eastern Command in June 1940.

14. WW2 Australian Army khaki drill uniform jacket and trousers to Staff Sergeant R. E. Hall, who after he was commissioned, was later wounded in action at Aitape on 3/6/1945. Khaki drill two pocket heavy cotton jacket with five

blackened bronze Australian Military Forces buttons to centre seam and pockets. Displaying rising sun collar badges (pair) and engineer staff sergeant badge on the upper right sleeve, a 2-year blue cloth chevron on the lower right sleeve. AUSTRALIA brass shoulder titles (2) to each shoulder board. Unlined with size tag M. TX named R.E. HALL N108022.; khaki drill two pocket heavy cotton long trousers with pressed metal buttons. Label to the inner waist V157 1942 SIZE 1943 MADE IN AUSTRALIA. Both are in very good condition. They come with service record extracts. CN1. Est: \$250 to \$300

Lieutenant Richard Edward David Hall was from Sydney, New South Wales. He served in Darwin and New Guinea with the Royal Australian Engineers. Commissioned Lieutenant October 1943. Wounded in Action and badly burnt at Aitape 3/6/1945.

15. WW2 Australian Army khaki drill 2/33rd Battalion uniform jacket and trousers. Khaki drill two pocket heavy cotton jacket with five blackened bronze Australian Military Forces buttons to centre seam and pockets. Displaying rising sun collar badges (pair) and sergeant's badge on the upper right sleeve, 2/33rd Battalion colour patches affixed to each upper arm. AUSTRALIA brass shoulder titles (2) to each shoulder board. Unlined with SNOWS MENSWEAR LTD MELBOURNE label inside pocket CPL F. FINCH 9867. Khaki drill three pocket heavy cotton long trousers with pressed metal buttons. Label to the inner waist V326 1942 SIZE MADE IN AUSTRALIA. J WALSH written to the inner waist. Trousers are in near new condition and whilst the jacket shows sign of wear around the collar it is still in very good condition. They come with research notes by Lt. Colonel Neil Smith. CN1. Est: \$250 to \$300

Sergeant John Finch was from Ballarat, Victoria. He served with the Militia before transferring to the 2/33rd Battalion A.I.F., serving as a sergeant in New Guinea.

- **16. WW2** Australian Army service uniform A.I.F. (Middle East) Base Area uniform jacket and trousers. Four pocket heavy khaki wool jacket with four blackened bronze Australian Military Forces buttons to centre seam (top button Bakelite) and pockets. Displaying rising sun collar badges (pair) and sergeant's badge on the upper right sleeve, A.I.F. (Middle East) Base Area and L of C Cash offices colour patches affixed to each upper arm, two blue service chevrons on right cuff. AUSTRALIA brass shoulder titles to each shoulder board with 1939 45 Star and Africa Star ribbons on left chest. Unlined with ESMODES 1940 label, the jacket has been 'taken in' at the back. Service uniform heavy khaki wool trousers with pressed metal buttons. Label to the inner waist N490 1942 SIZE 16. Jacket and trousers are in near new condition with only slight mothing. CN1. Est: \$200 to \$250
- 17. WW2 Australian Army 2/2nd Field Regiment uniform jacket attributed to VX773 Sergeant Harrell Day. Four pocket brown wool jacket, with blackened brass buttons to centre seam, pockets and shoulder boards, with rising sun collar and Australia shoulder badges to shoulder boards. Sergeant stripes and artillery qualified metal badge to right sleeve, with 2/2 F.R. and H.Q. Land Forces large and small unit patched to upper sections of both sleeves, as well as three service stripes to lower right cuff. There are service ribbons to upper left pocket and a handmade leather lanyard with a beer bottle opener to left pocket. Interior unlined, with factory label

showing name, number and 1943 date of manufacture. Overall, the jacket is in very good condition, with minor wear, approx. size 40. Jacket comes with research. CN7. Est: \$200 to \$300

18. WW2 Australian Army khaki drill uniform jacket attributed to Lieutenant Albert Packer, ex WW1 Australian Flying Corps pilot. Khaki drill four pocket heavy cotton jacket with four blackened bronze Australian Military Forces buttons to centre seam and pockets. Cloth waist belt present with bronzed buckle. Displaying rising sun collar badges and lieutenant's 2 bronzed metal stars on shoulder boards. An original set of cloth Australian Flying Corps pilot qualification wings sewn to left breast over 1914 – 15 Star, British War and Victory ribbon bar pinned to jacket. Unlined no labels with name tag A.G. PACKER to inner collar. The jacket has been worn but is in very good condition. It comes with a spare medal ribbon bar, copies of photos, newspaper article, service records for WW1 and WW2. CN1. Est \$2000 to \$2500

Lieutenant Albert George Packer was born in Adelaide, South Australia in 1896 and enlisted in the Australian Imperial Force on 17/9/1914. Initially serving as a Private in the 300th Company Mechanical Transport, he left Australia on 22/12/1914 bound for Egypt. In November 1917, he transferred to the Australian Flying Corps (AFC) as a cadet. He was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant on 31/8/1918 and served with No. 4 Squadron, A.F.C., during the final months of World War I. No. 4 Squadron was active on the Western Front, performing fighter sweeps, providing air support for the army, and raiding German airstrips. After the war, Packer returned to Australia in December 1918. Between the wars he founded Eyre Peninsular Airways (2/11/1928) in Adelaide with fellow director J.H. Moate. They operated airline services from Adelaide to South Australian regional towns on the Eyre Peninsular. The company ceased operating in July 1939. During World War 2, Packer re-enlisted in the Australian Military Forces on 7/8/1940 as a Lieutenant, serving in the 4 Garrison Battalion (SA) for home defence.

- 19. WW2 era Australian Army Royal Military College (Duntroon) uniform blazer attributed to Brigadier Peter John Tuckett. Red and black wool blazer, with brass RMC buttons to centre seam, with blazer emblem patch to left pocket, name tagged with MTX tailor tag. Approx size 38. Whilst Tuckett would have been commissioned during the early 1960s, this is a WW2 era manufactured jacket. CN7. Est: \$150 to \$250
- 20. Late 1940s Royal Australian Regiment uniform jacket, beret, camera and photograph album. Four pocket khaki wool pattern 1939 tunic with four blackened brass Australian Military Forces buttons to the centre seam, buttons to pocket flaps, cuffs and shoulder boards. Displaying gilt rising sun collar badges, blackened brass AUSTRALIA shoulder titles and cloth ROYAL AUSTRALIAN REGIMENT shoulder titles on each arm. Interior is unlined with 1945 dated production label to right inner chest, card size label also affixed, size 80 chest 39, height 5'10". Unissued very good condition.; Dark blue woolen beret with Australian label, name tag illegible.; 35mm Regulette camera with leather carry case.; Black photograph album, containing black and white Japanese family pictures, possibly 1950s. - 21. 1960s Vietnam War era Australian Army battle dress uniform jacket and trousers, attributed to Major Ernest 'Wally' Marshall MM, who was serving with the Special Air Service Regiment, who had won his Military Medal whilst serving with the 2/4th Independent (Commando) Company in Timor during WW2. Two pocket khaki wool BD jacket, with S.A.S.R. flashes to both arms, Major's crowns to both shoulder boards and his WW2 campaign and gallantry medal ribbons above the left pocket. Some wear and light mothing to cloth, with the tailor interior tag/stamp showing manufacture in 1953 with his surname and #3370 showing. The matching cloth trousers have had an additional pocket sewn to left thigh, similarly named, being dated 1951, with light wear and a few scattered light moth holes. The set is complete with two canvas belts with keepers; one named to Marshall and a polyester shirt and woollen tie. Jacket approx. size 40, pants approx. 34. CN7. Est: \$300 to \$400
- 22. 1960s Vietnam War era Australian uniforms of Brigadier Raymond Lewis Burnard AM who served in the S.A.S. and A.A.T.V. Woollen battle dress blouse dated 1968, displaying sewn on brigadier's rank shoulder boards, 'Red tabs' to each lapel, on the left breast the Infantry Combat Badge affixed over a sewn-on ribbon bar comprising Order of Australia, Korea, U.N. The story about a class of Australian fighting knuckle knives emerged in the 1990s, after having remained in relative obscurity for decades. They were made in the early 1940s by the Lithgow Small Arms Factory (L.S.A.F.) but were never distributed to the troops. The earliest modern reference is lan Skennerton's 1975 book – Australian Service Bayonets, which discusses experimental and prototype models.

- L.S.A.F.'s production efforts involved taking broken bayonet blades and adding a suitable grip to make a functional fighting knife. In June 1990, Major E.J.Millett, who, as head of Australian Army Ordnance, with responsibility for the L.S.A.F. published an article in Caps and Flints (a knife magazine of the day). It described the chronology where the L.S.A.F. to meet a growing need for fighting knives, began producing 'knuckle duster knives' from P1907 bayonets. An excerpt from Millett's article addresses these knives:
- "..... large number of which had relatives in the forces resulting in requests being fed back to the L.S.A.F. for knuckle dusters, daggers etc. and many were produced on a semi-official basis by operators working in their own time and outside production runs, using material from parts that had failed inspection".

WX10392 Lieutenant Leo Paul Mayberry was born in Kalgoorlie on 18/3/1912 and was working as a 'soldier' in Perth in 1939, upon enlistment with the A.I.F. on 20/1/1940, he was serving as the Regimental Sergeant Major for the 2/13th Field Ambulance, having previously served as an NCO with the 44th Battalion. He embarked for the Middle East on 10/2/1941 and was commissioned as a Lieutenant on 16/11/1941. As one of the best examples of our country's fighting men during WW2, his story was summed up brilliantly in a newspaper article relating to his service in New Guinea and subsequent severe wounding and award of the Military Cross for Bravery by Haydon Lennard, ABC war correspondent, as featured in the West Australian newspaper (5/6/1943, page 2)

'Lieutenant Leo Paul Mayberry, WX10392, of Perth, was awarded the M.C. Twice during the battle for Gona Lieutenant Mayberry showed outstanding courage and leadership in attacking enemy strong points and overcoming their resistance. In a charge across a village his party wiped out five Japanese posts. Later he was wounded in the arm but continued to encourage his men. But perhaps the bravest performance at Gona was put up by Lt L. P. Mayberry, of WA. He was ordered to attack and went in with a sergeant, a corporal and a few

privates. He was the only officer to get through the middle of Gona in this particular

assault. He entered the thick of the Jap defences, ordered his men to ground,

underwent bombing from the air and wiped out four enemy machine-gun nests in the jungle, often throwing grenades himself. He then got back safely to his own lines. The major then called on him as the final attack was in progress. He was partly knocked-out from his previous experience, but he went in for the last time. Getting up to a machine-gun nest he was shot in the hand and wounded in the head when holding a live grenade and about to throw it. He got down on the ground, called on his men to attack, transferred the live grenade to his left hand and threw it. Five minutes later the battle for Gona was over and won. Later Lt Mayberry received the MC. As a member of the famous WA 16th Battalion, it was announced on one occasion he was a prisoner of war by Japan, Lt L. Mayberry has returned to his home because of wounds and is now in Perth after having seen service in Syria and New Guinea. He was present at the last attack on the Japanese stronghold of Gona, and during that onslaught he was wounded and crawled back to his lines, leaving behind a notebook which perhaps was taken by the enemy and led to the statement that the Lieutenant was a prisoner of war. Lt Mayberry was connected with the firm of Messrs S. Smith and Sons before the war and later was attached to the permanent military forces in this state. He was in the same famous W.A. battalion as Capt W. M. Atkinson, MC and bar, Capt R. Christian, MC, and Capt E. P. Madigan, MC. These decorations were won in Syria, the Western Desert or New Guinea. The original written citation recommended him for the award of an Immediate Military Cross by Brigadier General I N Dougherty, the award being confirmed on 31/7/1943.

Petty Officer Alfred Briggs was born in Yarmouth, England in 1874. An engine cleaner by trade he enlisted into the Royal Navy as a stoker 2nd class on 10/2/1894. Over the next 12 years he served on a variety of H.M. ships and shore bases rising to the rank of stoker 1st class, his last posting being H.M.S. Powerful (cruiser) in the Australian Station. He took his discharge in Sydney on 2/3/1906. He enlisted into the Royal Australian Navy Reserve in Sydney on 10/7/1911 and to 'M' Reserve (Militia) on part time duty.

On the outbreak of the Great War, he enlisted into the Australian Naval and Military Expeditionary Force (A.N.M.F.) as an able seaman on 15/8/1914 being appointed petty officer three days later. He embarked on the Transport Berrima departing Sydney bound for New Guinea the following day. The 11/9/1914 was a historical day for Australia. It was the first time that Australian soldiers/sailors fought the Germans in the war. It was a hard-fought action too with losses to both sides culminating with a bayonet charge that won the day for Australia.

Briggs was part of No. 2 Company, commanded by Lieutenant Bowen that landed on Bitapaka (New Britain) at dawn on 11/9/1914. No. 2 Company consisted of 25 petty officers and men who were put ashore from the Australian destroyers at Kabakaul with instructions to seize the wireless station at Bitapaka. No. 2 Company advanced inland through the dense jungle towards the wireless station capturing the first of several German trenches and took prisoner three German soldiers (one wounded) and 20 native soldiers. It became rapidly apparent that the small force was insufficient for the task and a further fifty-nine men from the two destroyers, were despatched to assist. A totally insufficient force as it turned out as only 14 were armed with rifles, the rest with cutlasses and pistols.

By this stage Lt Bowen's group (and Briggs) were pinned in front of German trenches by small arms fire, with two men slowly dying of their wounds. Even with the additional men they remained pinned. Subsequently ½ a battalion was landed and advanced to assist. Once reinforced, a bayonet charge on the main trench secured the position. A German officer and 20 men were captured with 4 Australians

killed, and 5 wounded. The Infantry Battalion Commanding Officer Elwell died leading the charge. The radio station was captured and the island surrendered on the 17th September.

Briggs survived the campaign and returned to Melbourne on 19/2/1915 and was employed in the Naval Docks Police for the remainder of the war. Post war he was employed as the caretaker of Pinchgut (Fort Denison) in Sydney Harbour (newspaper article relates to this), he died in 1951 in Sydney. One of his two sons Stanley Denison Briggs, was born on Pinchgut on 27/7/1921, the second son Alfred William Bowron Briggs was killed in action on 4/3/1942.

Petty Officer David Burke was born in Queenstown, Ireland in 1882. He enlisted into the Royal Navy on leaving school as a Boy 2nd Class on 13/7/1899. He continued to serve until discharging to the Royal Fleet Reserve on 8/9/1912. He enlisted into the Royal Australian Navy in London on 15/1/1913 and was posted to the London Depot whilst H.M.A.S. Australia was finishing its construction. He joined the ship as a Leading Seaman on 21/6/1913 and was part of the crew that brought her back to Australia.

He was serving on H.M.A.S. Encounter (protected cruiser) from 12/1/1914 – 30/6/1915, on the outbreak of the Great War she was part of the force which occupied German New Guinea and captured the steamer Zambezi on the 12th August and on 14 September, bombarded Toma Ridge (on the island of New Pomerania) supporting the Australian Military and Naval Expeditionary Force which was besieging the town. She was thus the first R.A.N. ship to fire in anger. He discharged on 12/5/1919. His R.N. Long Service and Good Conduct medal was presented in Randwick in 1922. He continued to sail with the Australian Merchant Service post-war and died in New South Wales in 1950.

Chief Engine Room Artificer Richard Jewell Bayley was born in Portsmouth, England in 1867. He enlisted into the Royal Navy on 31/2/1889. He served in the R.N. in a variety of ship and shore bases, he discharged to a shore pension 8/3/1911 and to the Royal Fleet Reserve. He emigrated to Australia in 1912 and joined to Royal Australian Navy on 9/2/1912. He served in the R.A.N. during the Great War

serving on H.M.A.S. Swan (destroyer) from 16/8/1916 – 30/7/1919 conducting operations in the Adriatic. Post war he continued to serve in the R.A.N. until 31/12/1920 when he was discharged for the final time. He died in Sydney in 1942.

473.WW1 Royal Australian Naval Brigade medals to Deckhand George Bale.British War and Victory Medals named GEORGE BALE DECKHAND R.A.N.B. They come with research notes. CN24. Est: \$100 to \$200

George Bale was born in 1884, during WW1 he enlisted for service on 28/4/1917 and was based out of Sydney with #15. Whilst his service details are not readily accessible, he would have sailed into an active war zone to qualify for the Victory Medal.

Lieutenant Brant Joseph Addison was born in Aldinga, South Australia, on 25/7/1882. A sailor, he qualified as a 1st mate in 1907 and by the outbreak of the Great War, he was working as a ship's officer on a coastal merchant ship in Australia. He had previously served for 5 years in the Royal Naval Reserve. He enlisted into the Australian Imperial Force (A.I.F.) on 7/5/1915, promoted to acting sergeant he left Australia with the 13th Reinforcements 10th Battalion bound for Egypt on 11/1/1916. He deployed to France with the Battalion on 11/6/1916. He was discharged to a commission in the Royal Naval Reserve as a sub lieutenant on 21/5/1917, he served on H.M.S. PQ 51 (patrol boat) for the rest of the war He demobilised in Adelaide on 27/6/1919 and resumed his pre-war service in Australian coastal shipping. During WW2, he enlisted into the Royal Australian Naval Reserve on 7/12/1940 being appointed a lieutenant.

He served on H.M.A.S. Torrens (shore depot Adelaide) and H.M.A.S. Wongala (Port Adelaide examination vessel) until July 1944. He was medically discharged on 31/8/1944 and died in South Australia, on 5/7/1956.

Leading Seaman Eric Jack Baxter was born in Tirange, Victoria, Australia on 12/3/1920.He joined the Royal Australian Naval Reserve on 19/12/1938. He joined H.M.A.S. Canberra (heavy cruiser) serving on her from 16/3/1940 – 1/6/1940. He also served on H.M.A.S. Yarra (sloop), H.M.S. Lauderdale (destroyer), H.M.A.S. Quickmatch (destroyer), HMAS Nizam (destroyer), H.M.A.S. Adelaide (light cruiser) and H.M.S. Shropshire (heavy cruiser). He was demobilised on 5/3/1946.

Petty Officer Eric Albert Bellini was born in Balmain North, New South Wales on 23/6/1916. A grocer's assistant, he enlisted into the Royal Australian Navy on 12/6/1933. Pre-WW2, he served on a variety of ship and shore bases and on the outbreak of WW2, he was serving on H.M.A.S. Hobart (light cruiser) she was based in Singapore. Transferred to H.M.A.S. Vendetta (destroyer) he served on her from 21/10/1940 until April 1945. He finished the war as a petty officer being discharged on 22/7/1946. He died in New South Wales in 1986.

477. WW2 Royal Australian Navy medals to Petty Officer Kenneth Avery, who served aboard H.M.A.S. Yarra in the Red Sea and Persian Gulf and was part of the 'Tobruk Ferry Service'. 1939 – 45 Star, Africa Star, Burma Star with PACIFIC clasp, named K AVERY 23631(later naming style); Defence Medal named AVERY 23621 D (duplicate issue).; War Medal and Australian Service Medal 1939 – 45 named K. Petty Officer Kenneth Avery was born in Bullahdelah, New South Wales, Australia on 3/12/1921. A millhand by trade he enlisted into the Royal Australian Navy on 10/10/1939 for twelve years. He was posted to H.M.A.S. Yarra (sloop) serving from April 1040 – 13/2/1942, she was based in Aden and was assigned to convoy operations in the Red Sea. Subsequently he served on H.M.A.S. ML 424 and H.M.A.S. Warrego (sloop). He was dischargedon 1/12/1949. A note on his file states 'in view of circumstances, NEVER to be appointed to or have any association with Australian Sea Cadet Corps'. He died in Manilla, New South Wales, on 3/3/2007.

478. WW2 Royal Australian Navy medals to Leading Stoker George Cadwell, who served aboard H.M.A.S. Shropshire. He had previously deserted from the R.A.N. in 1922, only to rejoin in 1939. 1939 – 45 Star, Pacific Star, War Medal, Australian Service Medal 1939 – 45, Pacific Star unnamed all others named PH254 G. CADWELL. Swing mounted as worn, come with copies of service records and research notes. CN24. Est: \$150 to \$200

Leading Stoker George Cadwell was born in Carlton, Victoria in 1896. He enlisted into the Royal Australian Navy as a Stoker 2nd Class on 29/3/1920. He deserted in October 1922 and was subsequently discharged. Being a good bloke, he re-enlisted into the R.A.N. for WW2 service on 2/9/1939. Initially posted as an Armed Guard at Swan Island and guard for boat crews at H.M.A.S. Lonsdale (shore base). He served on H.M.A.S. Shropshire as a Leading Stoker from 25/6/1943 – 22/3/1946. She saw extensive service in the Pacific Islands and Philippines during the island campaigns

providing fire support. She was present at Tokyo Bay for the Japanese surrender in September 1945.

A storeman, he enlisted into the 30th Battalion (Militia) on 9/10/1941. He transferred into the 2nd AIF on 14/9/1942. He deployed to New Guinea with the Battalion landing on 14/1/1944, they were part of the 8th Brigade and were in support of the 9th Division. He fought in the Huon Peninsula campaign and notably the Battle of Sio. Returned to Australia on 27/12/1945 for discharge on 5/5/1946. He died in June 1995.

Alfred William Bowron Briggs was born in Annandale, Sydney, New South Wales, Australia on 6/4/1913. He enlisted into the Royal Australian Navy on 7/1/1933, signing on for 12 years as a cook. On the outbreak of WW2, he was a leading cook serving on H.M.A.S. Yarra (sloop). The Yarra started the war patrolling Australian waters but transferred to the East Indies Station in 1940. There she patrolled the Red Sea and was involved in the Anglo-Iraqi War, and the Anglo-Soviet invasion of Iran. Deployed to the Mediterranean she was part of the Tobruk Ferry Service and was quickly deployed to Singapore when Japan entered the war. She was sunk on the 4/3/1942, when the convoy encountered the Japanese cruisers Atago, Takao, and Maya. The Yarra went down fighting, with only 34 out of the 160 crew, getting off. The survivors were picked up by a Dutch submarine five days later, with only 13 left alive. Sadly, Briggs was not one of them.

Lieutenant William Richard Devine was born in Clerkenwell, Middlesex, England on 28/2/1914. He emigrated to Australia in 1921 and enlisted into the Royal Australian Navy on 1/4/1935 as an ordinary seaman. He served on H.M.A.S. Canberra (cruiser) as a Leading Seaman from 11/6/1940 – 12/10/1941, before being transferred to H.M.A.S. Vampire (destroyer) serving on her from 29/10/1941 – 9/4/1942. She was part of the "Scrap Iron Flotilla" working in the Mediterranean taking part in the Greek Campaign as was part of the 'Tobruk Ferry Service'. Posted to H.M.A.S. Canberra from 7/7/1942 – 9/8/1942 he was aboard when she was sunk during the Battle of Savo Island. He returned to sea in H.M.A.S. Warrego (sloop) operating in New Guinea waters from August 1943 – January 1944 as a petty officer, finishing the war at H.M.A.S. Cerberus. He continued to serve post war and was sent to the London Depot (R.N.) as a commissioned gunner for advanced courses followed by a posting to H.M.A.S. Anzac (destroyer) for service in Korea from 6/8/1951 – 17/10/1951. Promoted to lieutenant in 1957, he died on 27/8/1965 whilst still in service.

483. WW2 – Korea Royal Australian Navy medals to Yeoman of Signals Paul Gardiner, who had served during WW2 aboard H.M.A.S. Adelaide and H.M.A.S. Koopa, and later in Korea aboard H.M.A.S. Chief Yeoman of Signals Paul Gardiner was born in Braidwood, New South Wales on 22/5/1910. He enlisted into the Royal Australian Navy on 16/12/1929. At the start of WW2, he was serving as a yeoman of signals on H.M.A.S. Moresby (sloop), he was transferred to H.M.A.S. Adelaide (light cruiser) on 20/9/1939 – 16/5/1942 patrolling Australian waters. He deserted on 16/5/1942 when the Adelaide returned to Sydney for a refit. It is unknown when he was returned to service as his next posting is ashore from 17/8/1942. Posted to H.M.A.S. Koopa (requisitioned ferry) from 12/9/1942 - 26/4/1945 as a yeoman of sigs. He finished the war on H.M.A.S. Nizam (destroyer) from 22/6/1945 – 17/10/1945 operating in the Philippines as part of the British Pacific Fleet. On 15/8/1945, Nizam received orders to cease hostilities; shortly after this, the ship was attacked by a Japanese fighter, which was shot down, she was in Tokyo Bay for the surrender. He also served on H.M.A.S. Bataan as the yeoman of signals from 27/6/1950 – 6/6/1951, From early July 1950 until 29/5/1951, she served in Korea patrolling, blockading, escorting aircraft carriers, and bombarding shore targets. He was transferred to the Royal Australian Fleet Reserve on 9/4/1952.

484. WW2 – Korea Royal Australian and Royal Navy medals Petty Officer Stanley Brown, who served aboard H.M.A.S. Sydney during the Korean War. Petty Officer Stanley Jack Brown was born in Acton, London in 1926. He served with the Royal Navy from 15/6/1943 – 10/7/1946, an electrician, he instructed in 'Electrical Technologies' in the R.N. He enlisted into the Royal Australian Navy on 16/8/1948 as an electrical mechanic 1 (Air). During his six years with the R.A.N. he served on a variety of ships and shore bases and was on H.M.A.S. Sydney (aircraft carrier) twice, this included the Korean War deployment 31/8/1951 – 22/2/1952 serving as an acting petty officer.

He discharged to shore on 17/8/12954 but continued to serve in the Royal Australian Fleet Reserve. He died in 2003.

485. Korean War Royal Australian Navy medals to Able Seaman Kenneth Flavell, who served aboard H.M.A.S. Bataan, having previously served with the Royal Navy during WW2. Korea Medal named 40853 K.A. FLAVELL.; United Nations Medal with KOREA clasp, unnamed. They come with copies of service records and research notes. CN24. Est: \$300 to \$400

Kenneth Albert Flavell was born in Leicester, England on 4/9/1925. He served in WW2 with the Royal Navy from 28/7/1943 – 4/10/1949, he enlisted into the Royal Australian Navy on 6/7/1950 in London. Posted to H.M.A.S. Sydney (light aircraft carrier) from 27/5/1950 – 16/3/1951, he was then posted to various shore bases until serving on H.M.A.S. Bataan (destroyer) from 15/10/1951 – 7/10/1952. This included a tour of Korean waters where the Bataan conducted patrols and fire support missions. He continued to serve until discharging in July 1956, he died in Sydney on 25/9/1980.

486. Korean War Royal Australian Navy medals to Signaller Albert Everson, who served aboard H.M.A.S. Warramunga. Korea Medal, United Nations Medal with KOREA clasp, both named 39287 A.S. EVERSON.; Australian Active Service Medal 1945 – 75 with Korea clasp (loose), Australian Service Medal 1945 – 75 with JAPAN clasp (loose), both named A.S. EVERSON R39287. Signaller Albert Stanley Everson was born in West Tamworth New South Wales, in 1932. A shop assistant, he signed on for six years with the Royal Australian Navy as a signaller on 25/10/1950. He served on H.M.A.S. Warramunga (destroyer) from 3/10/1951 – 11/11/1952. He was on her for her second tour (11/1/1952 – 12/8/1952) during which she used 4,151 4.7-inch shells in coastal bombardments. He discharged on 24/10/1956 and died in Taree, New South Wales in 1997.

487. Korean War Royal Australian Navy 'double D.S.C.' action medal group to Stoker Mechanic Thomas Cassidy, who served aboard H.M.A.S. Murchison

during the Han River naval battle, where Chinese forces attacked the ship in force over a two-day period in September 1951. Korea Medal, United Nations Medal with KOREA clasp, both named T.A. CASSIDY 36091. They come with copies of service records, photos, newspaper articles and research by Lt. Colonel Neil Smith. CN24. Est: \$700 to \$900

Note: Only 11 D.S.C.s awarded to the R.A.N. during the Korean War. This was the finest action of the Royal Australian Navy in the Korean War.

Thomas Athol Cassidy was born in Newtown, New South Wales in 1930. A labourer by trade he enlisted into the Royal Australian Navy as a stoker on 17/5/1948.

He served on a variety of Royal Australian Navy ships and bases including H.M.A.S. Murchison (frigate) from 23/11/1948 - 5/10/1950 and during the Korean War from 8/5/1951 - 4/9/1952, his Korean adventure packed in enough excitement to last a lifetime.

The tour stated with patrols and shore bombardments and on the 25/7/1951, Murchison, H.M.S. Cardigan Bay and the Korean Frigate PF62 initiated operations to probe the Han River, one of the main river systems used by the communist forces during the war. Over an 11-day period, they commenced to bombard shore targets such as troop concentrations, gun emplacements and ammunitions dumps, the Murchison alone expended 1,100 rounds of 4-inch ammunition. The river system was not conducive to normal water operations, meaning the ships needed to use all available means, such as recce patrols with small ship's boats to gain useful information.

The operation was repeated several times over the next two months with the initial Chinese opposition being limited to small arms fire and occasional rounds from 75 mm field-guns. However, the Chinese seriously responded on 28/9/1951, when the Murchison was ambushed near the mouth of the Yesong River.

The Chinese engaged the ship at a range of 2,000 meters with 75mm and 90mm field guns, mortars and small arms from three fortified villages, Murchison responded with the ships 4 x 4-inch guns and 5 x 40mm Bofors and was only able to withdraw in the narrow channel by dropping anchor and turning on the current. She was hit four times by the 75s and numerous small arms rounds, in reply she destroyed one of the 75mms and about 40 troops.

Two days later the mission was repeated however the fire was heavier, more accurate and 50mm anti-tank guns were also used. The Murchison was penetrated several times by 50 mm rounds which punched straight through its hull, a 75 mm round also penetrated to explode in the engine room. To complicate the matter a misty rain squall reduced visibility in the narrow channel, forcing Murchison to slow down almost to a halt. As the rain eased, she came under fire from a second entrenched position at 600 metres. Her return fire destroying the field gun, a mortar and several machine gun emplacements before she was clear.

As a result of the battle, Murchison received seven shell holes as well as extensive, minor damage from shrapnel and small arms fire which knocked out all of her Bofors and wounded 6 sailors (1 seriously). She expended some 276 rounds of 4-inch and 500 rounds from the 40mm Bofors during the battle.

The ship's captain Lt Commander A. N. Dollard and the Navigation Officer, Lt J. M. Kelly, were both awarded a well-earned Distinguished Service Cross. Cassidy was medically discharged on 30/4/1954 and died in Sydney in 1981.

Able Seaman Frank Barrett was born in Brisbane, Queensland on 5/12/1933. He joined the Royal Australian Navy on 28/9/1951. He served on a variety of R.A.N. ship and shore bases including H.M.A.S. Culgoa (frigate) from 28/1/1953 – 6/10/1953. She served in Korean from 19/4/1953 – 29/6/1953. He was discharged on 4/12/1957.

489. Korean War Royal Australian Navy medals to Naval Airman 1st Class Pilot's Mate Robert Craig, who served aboard H.M.A.S. Sydney for two tours of Korea. Naval Airman 1st Class Pilot's Mate Robert Guthrie Craig was born in Sunshine, Victoria in 1930. A labourer, he enlisted into the Royal Australian Navy (Air Wing) on 10/5/1948. He was posted to H.M.A.S. Sydney (aircraft carrier) from 16/7/1951 – 2/3/1952 as a naval airman 1st class pilot's mate (name change to air mechanic) for its first deployment to Korea. Sydney was operating Sea Furies at the time. This was followed by a posting ashore to H.M.A.S. Albatross, returning to the Sydney from 21/9/1953 – 8/6/1954 for a second deployment to Korea. He continued to serve until 25/9/1963 when he was discharged to shore.

490. Korean War Royal Australian Navy medals to Petty Officer Quartermaster Gunner Richard Clifford who served aboard H.M.A.S. Tobruk in Korea. Korea Medal, United Nations Medal with KOREA clasp, named 35829 R.P.H.J. CLIFFORD. They come with copies of service records, photo and research notes. CN24. Est \$200 to \$300

Richard Peter Henry James Clifford was born in St, Helens Tasmania, in 1930. A motor mechanic, he enlisted into the Royal Australian Navy on 2/3/1948. He served on a variety of H.M.A.S. ships and shore bases including H.M.A.S. Tobruk (destroyer) as a leading seaman from 4/8/1952 – 25/9/1958. H.M.A.S. Anzac (destroyer) 1/8/1958 – 29/8/1958 deploying to Malaya. He did four trips to Vietnam onboard H.M.A.S. Vampire (destroyer) in 1966, 1967 and 1969, as petty officer quartermaster gunner. He discharged on 31/9/1970 and died in Adelaide, South Australia.

491. Cold War era Royal Australian Navy submariners' medals to Paul Dann, who served aboard H.M.A.S. Orion, his service including 'special operations' work. Australian Service Medal with SPECIAL OPS clasp.; Australian Defence Medal. Both in original box of issue with matching miniatures named S136746 P E DANN (D). Paul Dann was serving with the engineering staff on H.M.A.S. Orion and was involved in two 'Spook' operations during the 1980s, during which the average dive was 42 days and the longest 56 days, conducting 6-hour watches. As to be expected, the correspondence does not give details of the patrols.

492. Pre WW1 Royal Australian Navy Long Service and Good Conduct Medal to Petty Officer Collins, who saw service at H.M.A.S. Cerberus. Royal Navy Long Service and Good Conduct Medal (G.V.R.) named 139352 W. COLLINS P.O. H.M.A.S. CERBERUS. It comes with copies of R.N. and R.A.N. service records. CN24. Est: \$300 to \$400

Petty Officer Walter Collins was born in St John, Southampton, England in 1871. He enlisted into the Royal Navy as a boy 2nd class on 24/3/1886. He served for the next 26 years in a variety of H.M. ship and shore bases including the Coast Guard (chief boatman) before being transferred to the Royal Fleet Reserve on 28/12/1912. He enlisted into the Royal Australian Navy at the London Depot as a leading seaman on 8/5/1913. Posted to H.M.A.S. Cerberus from 23/5/1913 – 1/8/1914 being awarded his Long Service and Good Conduct Medal on 4/7/1913. He served on a variety of H.M.A.S. shore bases until being discharged on 22/2/1919. He then worked for Port Melbourne in a civilian role until 1926.

493. WW2 Royal Australian Naval Reserve medals to Commander Philip Lionel Sharp who served on H.M.A.S. Manoora. The son of a Russian Jewish emigrant, post war he became a lawyer and Queens Council.

1939 – 45 Star, Pacific Star unnamed as issued, War Medal and Australian Service Medal 1939 – 45 both named P. SHARP R.A.N.R. Swing mounted as worn with matching miniatures. They come with copies of service records and newspaper articles.

Commander Philip Lionel Sharp Q.C. was born in Perth, Western Australia in 1921. His father Benzion Sharp being born in Russia in 1895. He enlisted into the Royal Australian Naval Reserve as an ordinary seaman on 12/5/1941. After basic training at Leeuwin and Cerberus, he was posted to H.M.A.S. Canberra (heavy cruiser) from 28/5/1942 – 29/6/1942 being lucky to avid the fate of his crew mates when she was sunk in August. After attended officer training at Cerberus he was promoted to sub lieutenant on 6/10/1942 and sent to H.M.A.S. Assault (shore base, training for boat crews for landing craft, beach commandos to prepare beaches and co-ordinate landings on the shore, and signals sections to facilitate communications between ships and land-based forces). Following the course he was posted to H.M.A.S. Manoora (passenger ship converted into the R.A.N.'s first landing ship, infantry (LSI) from 15/1/1943 – wars end. After extensive training, the Manoora was involved in most of the Allied amphibious operations in the Pacific during 1944 and 1945 earning six battle honours for her wartime service: "Indian Ocean 1941–42", "Pacific 1942-45", "New Guinea 1944", "Leyte Gulf 1944", "Lingayen Gulf 1945", and "Borneo 1945. Promoted to lieutenant in April 1945, his last posting being to Leeuwin from 20/2/1946 – 4/4/1946 when he was demobilized. Post war he practiced law and

was admitted to the bar in 1949, later becoming a Queens Council, he continued to serve in the R.N.V.R., retiring as a commander in 1981.

494. Royal Australian Fleet Reserve medal to Petty Officer Burrows, who served in WW2 on H.M.A.S. Bungaree - Australia's only minelayer. Royal Fleet Reserve Long Service and Good conduct Medal (G.VI.R) named 16660 P.O. S.M. P.E. BURROWS. RAFR. It comes with copies of service records. CN24. Est: \$350 to \$450

Only 230 G.VI.R. medals issued to Australians.

Petty Officer Percy Edward Burrows was born in Perth, Western Australia in 1902. He enlisted into the Royal Australian Navy on 18/6/1925 as a Stoker. He transferred to the Royal Australian Fleet Reserve on 31/7/1939. Mobilised for WW2 he served on H.M.A.S. Kuttabul (depot ship), H.M.A.S. Bungaree (mine layer) from 18/6/1941 – 1/7/1942. H.M.A.S. Kinchela (boom gate ship Brisbane), Melville (Darwin shore base) being demobilised on 10/1/1946 with the rank of petty officer. He died in 1990 in Victoria.

495. Medal of the Order of Australia and Korea War medals to Private Maxwell Filer, who served in Korea with the 3rd Battalion Royal Australian Regiment, later being awarded his Medal of the Order of Australia for his work to the veteran community in 1979.

Maxwell Harold Filer was born on 1/12/1928 in Melbourne, Victoria. He served with the 3rd Battalion Royal Australian Regiment in Korea from 15/5/1951 – 15/7/1951, an unusually short period and well worth further research. Post war he was involved in various clubs and association, of interest is the Belgian medal presented to him by the National Socialistische Beweging for meritorious service in 1978. He died in Perth, Western Australia in 1992.

496. WW1 New Zealand 1918 'Second Battle of Amman' Military Cross to Lieutenant Walter Cobb of the New Zealand Machine Gun Squadron. Previously at Gallipoli he was the sole survivor of his section after seeing action with the Wellington Mounted Rifles at Chunuk Bair.

Military Cross (G.V.R.), reverse engraved 11/26 Lieut Walter Cobb.; 1914 – 15 Star named 11/26 LT. W. COBB. N.Z.E.F.; British War and Victory Medals named 11/26 LIEUT W. COBB. Original black and white photos (19), officer's bronze stars (3), uniform buttons (5) one Turkish, 16th Waikato Regiment cap badge (missing lug), spent rifle bullet. Military Cross: 2nd Supplement to London Gazette 3/10/1919. Citation: For conspicuous gallantry and good work near Ammon on 25th. Sept 1918. He made a personal reconnaissance under rifle and machine gun fire to, help on attacks by troops on right, and at the critical moment rushed his guns forward and brought enfilade fire to bear on the enemy positions, thus greatly assisting in the capture of six machine guns and one hundred prisoners.

Captain Walter Leonard Cobb was born in Liverpool, England in 1886. He emigrated to New Zealand pre–Great War and was working as an attendant at a Mental Hospital. He enlisted into the Wellington Mounted Rifles on 13/8/1914, he deployed with the regiment to Egypt arriving on 3/12/1914.

He landed on Gallipoli with the regiment on 9/5/1915, being promoted sergeant on 29/8/1915, he is mentioned in the book 'Bloody Gallipoli, The New Zealander's Story p193 (Chunuk Bair) 'The few machine gunners fought bravely considering they were targeted by the Turks and had to overcome battle damage to the guns and shortage of ammunition. Of the 14 belonging to the Wellington Mounted, only three survived. Trooper Cobb an expert machine gunner, fought courageously. At one stage he was called on to repair a gun that had been put out of action and had to cross from the left to the right flank, over intervening ground which in parts had not been entrenched. A photograph is captioned 'Trooper Cobb with a captured Turkish Maxim machinegun. Cobb had earlier done excellent work on Chunuk Bair on 9 August. Cobb was the only surviving member of the Wellington Mounted Rifles machine gun section when this photograph was taken.

On 13/6/1915 he was part of the Machine Gun Detachment Anzac Cove. He evacuated with the unit on Christmas day 1915, returning to Egypt. Shortly after he was transferred to the Machine Gun Squadron in July 1916 being promoted to warrant officer at the same time.

Promoted to 2nd lieutenant on 1/1/1917 and transferred to the ANZAC Brigade in April 1917. He was awarded the Military Cross for his actions during the Second Battle of Amman. He survived the war returning to New Zealand to serve in the Home Guard in WW2 with the rank of captain. He died in Wellington, New Zealand in 1974.

497. WW1 Australian 1918 'Michael Offensive' Military Medal group to Corporal Harry Hughes, Australian Heavy Trench Mortar Battery, who received his M.M. as an immediate award for his actions defending the battery when the Germans overran the position, Hughes being wounded in the process.

Military Medal (G.V.R.) named 3318 GNR H. HUGHES. AUST CORPS T.M.BY.; 1914 – 15 Star named 3318 PTE H. HUGHES. 3/BN A.I.F.; British War and Victory Medals named 3318 BDR H. HUGHES. 3 BN. A.I.F.; Silver War Badge (renumbered); uniform colour patches (3), including Australian Heavy Trench Mortar Battery cloth shoulder patch.; Rising sun cap badge.; diaries (2).; leather wallet, post cards, ribbon, Lance Corporal chevron. Military Medal: Commonwealth Gazette 12/12/1918.

Corporal Harry Hughes was born in Gosford, New South Wales in 1897. During WW1 he was working as a carter when he enlisted into the AIF on 6/8/1915 he had only just turned 18 and required his parent's permission to enlist as he was under 21. Assigned to the 11th Reinforcements 3rd Battalion he left Australia bound for Egypt on 2/11/1915. He marched into the 53rd battalion in February 1916 and the following month to the 5th Divisional Artillery 25th Howitzer Brigade. He deployed with the Brigade to France in June 1916. He was transferred to the 5th Division Trench Mortar Brigade (Y5A battery) on 21/7/1917, posted again on 16/2/1918 to Australian Corps Heavy Trench Mortar Battery.

He was serving with No. 2 battery in action near Wulverghem when the German Michael Offensive descended on them. The war diary makes for desperate reading with the 1st paragraph for April states 'Records from the 1st of April to the 10th had to be destroyed to prevent them from being captured by the enemy'. On 10/4/1918 the enemy attacked at 5 am this morning, all six guns of this battery captured. He was wounded in the action receiving a gunshot wound to his left foot, being hospitalised until 21/4/1918. His diary covers this period. He was promoted to Lance Corporal during this period and remained with the unit until the war's end. He returned to Australia for discharge on 20/10/1919. He resided in New South Wales until his death in 1961.

498. Boer War Queen's South Africa Medal to Trooper Alfred Burgin, who served with the 1st New South Wales Lancers. Queen's South Africa Medal with 5 clasps CAPE COLONY, ORANGE FREE STATE, JOHANNESBURG, DIAMOND HILL, BELFAST, named 895 TPR A.A. BURGIN. N.S.W. LRS. With pinback fitting. It comes with copies of medal rolls and newspaper articles. Scarce. CN36. Est: \$2000 to \$2500

Alfred Arthur Burgin was born in Parramatta, New South Wales, in 1877. He served with the New South Wales Lancers in South Africa and saw serious fighting. A letter home describes of the action at Kimberly firing his rifle until it was too hot to handle. They captured three prisoners and 'would have settled for them' if it wasn't for an officer stopping us. Post war he returned to Australia working as a postman, he died in Cowra in 1957.

499. Boer War Queen's South Africa Medal Western Australian Queen's South Africa medal to Private Bruce Bird, who served with the 6th Western Australian Mounted Infantry. Queen's South Africa Medal with 3 clasps TRANSVAAL, ORANGE FREE STATE, SOUTH AFRICA 1901, named 322 PTE B. BIRD. W.

AUSTRALIAN M.I. It comes with copy photos and Department of Defence correspondence. Clasps held in place by bent wire. CN12. Est: \$1000 to \$1200

Bruce Earnshaw Bird was born in Perth, Western Australia in 1879. He had served with the Albany Volunteer Artillery when he enlisted into the 6th Western Australian Mounted Infantry Contingent. He deployed with the unit to South Africa in March 1901. He returned to Australia on 29/4/1902. He died in 1971 in Albany, Western Australia. See lot #512 for his brother's WW2 'Z' Force medals.

500. Boer War Queen's South Africa Medal to Trooper Sidney Mogg, who served with the Australian Commonwealth Horse. Queen's South Africa Medal with 2 clasps TRANSVAAL, SOUTH AFRICA 1902, named 997 PTE S. MOGG AUST. COM. H. it comes with research by Lt. Colonel Neil Smith and copy medal roll. CN36. Est: \$400 to \$500

Sidney Mogg was born in Luton, South Australia in 1875. He was working as a station hand (possibly Edowie Station, South Australia) when he enlisted for service in South Africa with 'D' Squadron, 2nd Battalion Commonwealth Horse on 6/1/1902. He left South Australia bound for South Africa on 20/2/1902 landing on the 14th of March. He returned to Australia in July for discharge on 14/8/1902. He died in South Australia in 1949.

501. Boer War Queen's South Africa Medal to Lieutenant Reginald Norman Joseph Stourton, from Tasmania, who served with the Scottish Horse and the 3rd Australian Commonwealth Horse. Queen's South Africa Medal (1899 – 1902), with 5 clasps, CAPE COLONY, ORANGE FREE STATE, TRANSVAAL, SOUTH AFRICA 1901, SOUTH AFRICA 1902, impressed named LIEUTENANT R.N.J. STOURTON. SCOTTISH HORSE.; With matching miniature in case marked F.A. FLINT. LIVERPOOL ST, HOBART. Comes with copies of medal roll, newspaper articles and research. CN24. Est: \$600 to \$800

Lieutenant Reginald Norman Joseph Stourton was born in Morven, Tasmania, Australia on 4/10/1877. Educated at Hutchins School and Christ College Hobart and later at Surbiton House Naval School in England. He enlisted with the 1st Scottish Horse rising to the rank of sergeant (#7666, second #577). He served from 30/1/01 to 29/4/02. Discharged medically unfit he returned to Tasmania and was commissioned as a lieutenant to serve in the 3rd Australian Commonwealth Horse (Tas) having been given command of the Ross detachment of "I" Company. On returning to Tasmania at the wars end on 9/8/1902, he was presented with his medal by Lady Edeline Strickland. He returned to farming, dying in 1943.

502. Boer War Queen's South Africa Medal to Farrier Corporal George Steel, an Australian, who served with the 1st and 2nd Kitchener's Fighting Scouts.

Queen's South Africa Medal with 5 clasps CAPE COLONY, ORANGE FREE STATE, TRANSVAAL, SOUTH AFRICA 1901, SOUTH AFRICA 1902, named 1225 TPR.G. STEET. KITCHENER'S F.S. It comes with copies of medal rolls and research by Lt. Colonel Neil Smith. CN24. Est: \$400 to \$500

George Alexander Steel was born in Hamilton, Victoria, Australia in 1882. A watchman by trade, he enlisted with the 1st Kitchener's Fighting Scouts on 27/8/1901 and was in action near Pietersburg. He re-enlisted with the 2nd K.F.S. as a farrier corporal on 9/10/1901 and was in action near Warm Baths, Zand River Poort, Rustenburg and Boschbult, discharging on 7/7/1902 in Johannesburg when the regiment disbanded. He died in Melbourne in 1945. He appears in some documents as 'Steet'.

503. Boer War – WW1 British/Australian medals to Lance Corporal George Laws, who served with the South African Constabulary during the Boer War. He later emigrated to Queensland and served with the 5th Battalion A.I.F. on Gallipoli, later becoming a 'gas attack' casualty at Passchendaele. Queen's South Africa Medal with 5 clasps CAPE COLONY, ORANGE FREE STATE, TRANSVAAL, SOUTH AFRICA 1901, SOUTH AFRICA 1902, named 370 TPR G.N. LAWS. S.A.C.; 1914 – 15 Star named 2178 PTE G.N. LAWS. 5/BN A.I.F.; British War and Victory Medals named 2179 L/CPL G.N. LAWS. 5 BN A.I.F. They come with copies of service records, medal rolls, photos and research by Lt. Colonel Neil Smith. CN24. Est: \$1200 to \$1500

Lance Corporal George Nixon Laws was born in Newcastle, Northumberland, England on 11/11/1878. A labourer by trade, he enlisted into the South Africa Constabulary in Newcastle, England on 10/2/1901. Originally assigned as a 3rd Class Trooper to 2nd Troop, he was posted to 20th Troop on 1/2/1902 and finally to 'B' Mobile Troop a year later in 1903. He purchased his discharge on 15/3/1903. He emigrated to Queensland, Australia pre-1913 and during the Great War enlisted into the 6th Reinforcements 5th Battalion on 15/3/1915 in Melbourne. He marched into the 5th Battalion on Gallipoli on 5/8/1915 and served near Lone Pine and Quinn's Post. He survived uninjured and withdrew with the Battalion on 18/12/1915. The Battalion deployed to France on 30/3/1916 and were in action by April near Flers and then Pozieres. Gassed at Ypres (Passchendaele) on 7/11/1917 he was evacuated to England returning to Australia on 22/3/1919 for a medical discharge 20/5/1919. He died in Queensland in 1961. His son Sergeant William Laws (R.A.A.F.) was killed on 24/11/1941, when his aircraft crashed at Evans Head during a training flight. He is buried in Sarina Cemetery, Queensland.

504. Boer War – WW1 British/Australian medals to Lieutenant Frederick Guillet-Guttridge, who served in South Africa with the 78th Company Imperial Yeomanry and in WW1 with the 51st Battalion A.I.F. being commissioned in 1917. Queen's South Africa Medal with 4 clasps CAPE COLONY, ORANGE FREE STATE, TRANSVAAL, SOUTH AFRICA 1901, named 15658 Q.M. SGT F.G. GUILLET. IMPL YEOMANRY.; British War and Victory Medals named LIEUT F.G. GUILLET-GUTTRIDGE. A.I.F. with original card box of issue. They come with copies of medal rolls, and service records for the Boer War and WW1. CN36. Est: \$500 to \$600

Lieutenant Frederick George - Guillet was born in Kensington, London in 1877. On the outbreak of the Boer War, he was working as a salesman and serving in the 14th Middlesex Rifle Volunteers (Militia) as a private. He volunteered for active service in South Africa, serving 14/4/1900 – 9/6/1901 with the 78th Company

Imperial Yeomanry. He finished as a company quartermaster sergeant demobilising on 16/6/1901.

He emigrated to Western Australia and was residing in Berverley running a property known as Guillet - Guttridge. During the Great War he enlisted into the 5th Reinforcements 51st Battalion on 23/2/1916.

He departed Australia on 20/9/1916 bound for France via England landing in France on 28/12/1916. He marched into the battalion on 17/2/1917 being commissioned as a 2nd lieutenant two months later on 15/4/1917 and lieutenant in October 1917. He survived the fighting around Ypres of that year including Messines and the battle of Polygon Wood.He was evacuated sick on 5/1/1918 being subsequently returned to Australia for discharge on 16/3/1918 with trench fever, rheumatism and neurosis. He returned to farming in W.A until retirement when he returned to England dying in Cornwall in 1952.

505. Boer War and WW1 medals to Private William Richardson, late 1st New South Wales Mounted Rifles, who was medically discharged from the Boer War with enteric fever, later serving with the 4th Pioneer Battalion A.I.F. in France. Queen's South Africa Medal with 2 clasps CAPE COLONY, DRIEFONTEIN, named 500 PTE W. RICHARDSON. N.S. WALES. M.R.' British War and Victory Medals named 1779 PTE W.H. RICHARDSON. 31 BN A.I.F. Court mounted for wear, they come with service records extracts, medal rolls and photo. CN36 Est: \$ 600 to \$700

William Henry Richardson was born in Kent, England. He served in the Boer War with the 2nd Contingent 'D' Squadron,1st New South Wales Mounted Rifles. He left Australia in January 1900 but was invalided back to Australia on 17/8/1900 with enteric fever. Pre-Great War he was working as a miner in Queensland when he enlisted into the 2nd Re-enforcements 31st Battalion on 10/11/1915. On landing in Egypt, he was posted to the 47th Battalion in March, however possibly due to his mining skills (and age) was transferred to the 4th Pioneer Battalion on 16/3/1916. He deployed with the battalion to France on 11/6/1916, returning to Australia on 5/7/1917 for medical discharge.

506. Boer War – WW1 British/Australian medals to Sergeant Bertie Harper, who served with the 10th Hussars during the Boer War, later with the 10th Battalion A.I.F. in WW1, being wounded in action May 1918 as a result of 'friendly fire'. Queen's South Africa Medal with 5 clasps CAPE COLONY, ORANGE FREE STATE, TRANSVAAL, SOUTH AFRICA 1901, SOUTH AFRICA 1902, named 4047 PTE B HARPER 10TH RL HUSSARS.; British War and Victory Medals named 6129 A-CPL R.W. HARPER (B.W. on Victory) 10 BN A.I.F. they come with copies of service records, medal rolls, war diary extracts, pictures. CN24. Est: \$300 to \$400

Sergeant Bertie William Harper was born in Bromley, Kent in 1880. A carman by trade he was serving in the 3rd Battalion Royal West Kent Regiment (Militia) when he enlisted into the 10th (Prince of Wales's Own Royal) Hussars on 8/11/1898. His service did not start well as he was charged with insubordination and spent 112 days in the cells from July – December 1900. During the Boer War he joined the regiment in South Africa serving from 23/2/1901 – 24/9/1902. Post-war he was stationed in India from 25/9/1902 – 25/1/1907. He emigrated to South Australia before the Great

War and was working as a driver when he enlisted into the 19th Reinforcements 10th Battalion on 17/2/1916. He deployed to France marching into the 10th Battalion on 16/11/1916. He was wounded in action on 30/5/1918 receiving a gunshot wound to his neck (some documents state shell wound). He subsequently returned to Australia in for a medical discharge in 1919. He died in South Australia in June 1924.

Archbishop Harold Eustace Sexton was born in Norwood, South Australia, in 1888. He was educated at the Collegiate School of St. Peter followed by Trinity College, Dublin, and Keble College, Oxford. He was ordained deacon in 1911 and priest in 1912, in the diocese of Ballart, Australia. During the Great War he enlisted into the A.I.F. Chaplains Corps as a chaplain 4th class (captain) on 27/11/1916. He deployed to France on 30/7/1917 being attached to 39th Battalion on 12/8/1917 and to 11th Brigade Headquarters 31/12/1917. Attached for duty to 3rd Australian General Hospital, Abbeville 9/7/1918. He returned to Australia for discharge 19/3/1920. He remained in the church for the remainder of his life with his last position being Archbishop of the Diocese of British Columbia. He died in Victoria in 1972.

Richard Joseph Massie Evans was born in Newtown, New South Wales in 1895. A clerk by trade he was serving with the 38th Infantry Regiment (Militia) when he enlisted into the 23rd Reinforcements Army Service Corps on 18/10/1916. He married before leaving. He deployed to France as a driver with the 3rd Division Train on 20/12/1917. He discharged on 3/10/1918. He died in 1967 in Caloundra, Queensland.

Richard Henry Noel Evans was born on 4/6/1917, he met his father for the first time on his return from England in 1918, as per newspaper articles. He enlisted into the R.A.N. on 29/5/1941 as an Ordinary Seaman. He was sent to the London depot on 13/10/1941, he attended H.M.S. Osprey (shore base Anti-Submarine School) before returning to Australia. He was posted to H.M.A.S. Yandra (converted civilian ship, minesweeper and anti-submarine vessel) as an Able Seaman serving on her from 16/2/1943 – 21/9/1944. He was commissioned as a Sub Lieutenant on 4/6/1945, serving in this capacity on H.M.A.S. Gympie (corvette) until being demobilised on 9/1/1946. He died in Ulladulla, New South Wales in 1997.

510. WW2 Australian El Alamein 'killed in action' medals to Private Irvine Dickson, 2/24th Battalion, who died in the fighting at Tel el Eisa on 22/7/1942. 1939 – 45 Star, Africa Star, Defence Medal, War Medal, Australian Service Medal 1939 – 45, all named VX57639 I.S. DICKSON, with black and white photograph and copies of service record extracts. CN23. Est: \$500 to \$600

Irvine Sinclair Dickson was born in Ayr, Scotland in 1915. He emigrated to Australia pre-war and was working as a labourer in New South Wales when he enlisted into the 2nd A.I.F. at Albury on 11/6/1941. He deployed from Australia on 3/9/1941 bound for Egypt, landing on the 23rd of that month. He marched into the 2/24th Battalion on 11/11/1941 on their return from Tobruk. He was killed in action during the disastrous attack on enemy positions guarding the coastal road near Tel el Eisa on 22/7/1942. Initially posted as wounded, then missing and finally killed in action. He has no known grave and is commemorated at the El Alamein Cemetery. The battalion history 2/24th carries an excellent description of the battle covering an entire chapter.

Lieutenant Athol Louis Casper was born in Perth, Western Australia in 1909. A bank clerk, he was serving as a Sergeant in the 3rd Field Company Engineers (Militia) when WW2 broke out. He enlisted into the A.I.F. on 30/7/1940 and was selected for Officer Training, being posted to 28th Battalion in Northam (W.A). He departed Australia bound for Egypt as part of the 6th Reinforcements, 2/11th Battalion in April 1941, landing in May. He was posted to various training battalions until joining the 2/11th Battalion to return to Australia March 1942. He deployed to New Guinea (29/1/1945 – 20/11/1945) returning to Australia for discharge 20/12/1945 in Perth. Post-war he was a prominent member of the Perth Jewish community being awarded the Silver Jubilee Medal in 1977. He died in Perth in 1993.

512. WW2 Australian Z Special Unit ('Z Force') medals to Sergeant Arthur Bird. War Medal, Australian Service Medal 1939 – 45, both named W31008 A. L. BIRD. They come with copies of research by Lt. Colonel Neil Smith. CN18. Est: \$600 to \$700

Sergeant Arthur Lancelot Bird was born in Perth, Western Australia in 1888. Pre-WW2 he was working as an agricultural bank Inspector and Health Department Inspector. He had previously served with the Malacca Volunteer Rifles and enlisted into the 19th Garrison Battalion in Albany, W.A. on 31/10/1940. He served in a

variety of locations in Western Australia until attending a Malay language School in 1944 and was then posted to Z Special Unit Intelligence Section, A Branch, Western Command on 12/7/1944. No doubt due to his previous experience in Malaya prewar. He was posted to Z Special Unit Training School, Fraser Island, Queensland from 24/7/1944 – 12/10/1945 as a Sergeant Malay Language Instructor. He was given the agent code number AK225 which indicates that he received operational training and was allocated for instructional or camp staff duty. He was discharged on 1/11/1945 in Perth, he died there in 1980.

Private Albert John Warner was born in London, England in 1902. He served in the Australian Army as a Cook, serving from 13/10/1942 – 26/3/1946, including Borneo with the 15th Australian Field Baking Platoon from May 1945.

514. WW2 Australian 'died of burns' medals to Gunner Geoffrey Layton, 2/3rd Field Regiment, who was badly burnt whilst cleaning toilets with petrol in New Guinea. 1939 – 45 Star, Pacific Star, War Medal and Australian Service Medal all named VX70203 G.T.K. LAYTON. In original card box of issue, with accompanying documents. They come with copies of service records and photo. CN36. Est: \$400 to \$500

Geoffrey Thomas Kingdon Layton was born in Ballarat, Victoria in December 1922. A clerk, he enlisted into the 2nd AIF on 30/12/1941. He served in various artillery units in Australia whilst undergoing training. He was posted to the 2/3rd Field Regiment and deployed to New Guinea on 13/11/1944. He was badly burnt in a fuel explosion on 18/2/1945 whilst assisting the hygiene personnel to clean ablutions. He suffered second degree burns to his body, limbs and face, he died a month later on 21/3/1945. He is buried in the Lae War Cemetery with his brother Charles Robert Layton who was killed in action on 10/1/1944 whilst serving with the 2/9th Battalion.

515. WW2 Australian medals to Private Albert Heiser, **42nd Battalion**, **Queensland Militia.** War Medal 1939 – 45 named Q35783 A.A.H. HEISER.; Efficiency Medal (G.VI.R.) with bar AUSTRALIA named Q35783 PTE A.A.H. HEISER 42 BN. 11/2/42. Court mounted for display. CN36. Est: \$150 to \$250

Albert Abraham Hymen Heiser was born in Rockhampton, Queensland in 1895. A greengrocer he enlisted on 3/2/1930 into the 42nd Battalion (Militia) serving with them as a bandsman. Awarded his Efficiency Medal in February 1942 he was medically discharged 'unfit for service' on 20/9/1941. He died in Rockhampton in 1968.

Lewis Blazitis was born in Bellshill, Scotland in November 1925, his parents being from Lithuania. He served in the British Army (#14741363) during the tail end of WW2. Being too young to see active service, he was posted to India (3 years) qualifying for the War and Independence Medals whilst serving with the Royal Artillery. On demobilisation he was working in London when he enlisted into the Australian Army on 17/7/1952. Posted to Japan for advanced training in May 1953, he proceeded to Korea to join 3 R.A.R. serving there from 25/7/1953 – 24/7/1954. Transferred to 2 R.A.R. he deployed with the Battalion to Malaya serving there from 8/10/1955 – 31/10/1957. He was discharged on 16/6/1958. His last known address being in Victoria.

518. WW2 – Korea Australian medals to Major Kenneth Bolton, a Regular Army Staff Officer who served in New Guinea with the 22nd Battalion. He later saw service during the Korean War with the 1st and 2nd Battalions of the Royal Australian Regiment. 1939 – 45 Star, Pacific Star, Defence Medal, War Medal, Australian Service Medal 1939 – 45 all named NX143350 K. BOLTON. Swing mounted.; United Nations Medal with KOREA clasp, unnamed.; matching miniature swing mounted medals and ribbon bar. They come with copies of service records and photos. CN24. Major Kenneth Bolton was born in Ashfield, New South Wales in 1915. A Duntroon graduate of 1939, he was posted as a Lieutenant to the Staff Corps followed by R.M.C. as an instructor. He deployed to New Guinea on 21/3/1944 into the Infantry Reinforcements Pool. He marched into the 22nd Battalion a week later with the rank of Captain. He returned to New Britain with the Battalion on 6/1/1945. Post war he continued to serve in various appointments including the Staff Corps as a Major in 1950, followed by the Royal Australian Regiment (R.A.R.). He served in Korea with the 2 R.A.R. from 9/1/1954 – 31/3/1954 transferring to 1 R.A.R. 31/3/1954 – 16/4/1954 and to the Reserve of Officers on 8/1/1955. He died in 1984.

519. WW2 – Korea Australian medals to Warrant Officer Class II Robert Cunningham, who was wounded in action with the 36th Battalion at Sanananda on 28/12/1942. He served with B.C.O.F. Japan and later Korea 1952 – 53. 1939 – 45 Star, Pacific Star both unnamed as issued.; War and Australian

Warrant Officer Class 2 Robert Arbuckle Cunningham was born in Glasgow. Scotland in 1913. He emigrated to Australia pre-war and during WW2 enlisted into the A.I.F. on 1/1/1942. He deployed with the Battalion to New Guinea on 24/5/1942. Stationed in Port Moresby. As the Japanese advanced on Port Moresby and reached Nauro in September. In December, the Battalion, was sent to Sanananda to take part in the Battle of Buna-Gona and between 19 – 26/12/1942. It also was in the attacks against the Japanese defences at Sanananda 26-28 December. The two weeks of fighting reduced the battalion to just 16 officers and 272 men. Cunningham being one of the wounded, receiving shrapnel wounds to his back on the 28th. He was evacuated out finishing in Sydney on 25/1/1943.

He deployed with the 36th Battalion to Lae on 29/3/1945 and was in operations in New Britain. He continued to serve post war and deployed to Kure, Japan with the 6th Labour Group in October 1946. He re-enlisted in August 1952 transferring to the Royal Australian Army Service Corps. He served in Korea from 4/12/1952 – 29/7/1953 with the Australian Ancillary Unit (R.A.A.S.C.) returning to Sydney for discharge on 30/9/1953.

520. Korean War medals to Private Bernard Butler, who served with the 2nd Battalion, Royal Australian Regiment. Korea Medal, United Nations Medal with KOREA clasp, both named 2/401538 B.H. BUTTLER and Korean War Service Medal. They come with research notes. CN24. Est: \$250 to \$350

Some 10,255 Greek personnel served in the campaign with 187 killed in action and 617 wounded in action. The Medal for the Korean Warriors 1952 was given to the men of the Greek Expeditionary Corps after being blessed by the Archbishop of Athens. Davis died in Melbourne in 1998.

522. Korea War medals Private Patrick Dacey, who served with the 3rd Battalion, Royal Australian Regiment. Korea Medal, United Nations Medal with Korea clasp, both named 2/3879 P. Distinguished Flying Cross, London Gazette 6/11/1943.

Citation: 'This officer has completed numerous operations against the enemy, in the course of which he has invariably displayed the utmost fortitude, courage and devotion to duty'.

Flight Lieutenant Norman Gardiner was born in Rakaia, New Zealand in 1921. He enlisted into the Royal New Zealand Air Force on 6/7/1941 as aircrew. After initial

training he proceeded to Canada for pilot training and then to England for further conversion training to heavy bombers. Posted to 12 Squadron R.A.F. (Lancaster bombers) he flew the first of his 33 missions on 13/5/1943, being commissioned pilot officer July 1943 and flying officer January 1944. During his tour he struck Bochum, Dortmund, Dusseldorf (2), Essen, Oberhausen, Cologne (3), Mulheim, Gelsenkirchen (2), Turin, Hamburg (5), Nurnberg, Milan (2), Munchen-Gladbach, Berlin (2), Munich, Hanover (2), Leipzig and Kassell.

Whilst he never sustained any personal injuries, he was forced to perform a belly landing after jettisoning bomb load when the aircraft would not lift due to weight/lack power. At the conclusion of his tour, he remained in England as an instructor. He returned to New Zealand in May 1945 serving with 40 Squadron R.N.Z.A.F. (transport DC3) delivering supplies in the Pacific theatre. He discharged on 12/12/1946. He re-enlisted in the R.N.Z.A.F. on 12/9/1949 serving until 5/10/1952 flying operational flights in Malaya, qualifying for the medal and clasp. He transferred to the Reserve October 1952, serving until 9/12/1976. He died in New Zealand in 2011.

526. WW2 Royal Australian Air Force medals to Flying Officer Noel Whitford, who flew Sunderland's with No. 10 Squadron, R.A.A.F. Coastal Command. 1939 – 45 Star, Atlantic Star, Africa Star with NORTH AFRICA 1942 -43 clasp affixed to ribbon, Defence Medal, War Medal, Australian Service Medal 1939 – 45 all named 21320 N.A.W. Flying Officer Noel Arthur William Whitford was born in Waratah, New South Wales, Australia in 1917. A fitter employed by B.H.P., responding to the call for qualified fitters to serve in the R.A.A.F. and enlisted on 17/6/1940. He served in Australia with various squadrons as a fitter until embarking for Egypt on 8/4/1941 with 451 Squadron, as a leading aircraftsman (fitter). He qualified as a flight engineer (aircrew) in January 1944, posted to England with various training postings until he joined 10 Squadron R.A.A.F. (Sunderland's) on 29/4/1944, flying with it until the end of the war. He flew some 534 operational hours on coastal patrols, being promoted to Flying Officer in July 1945. He returned to Australia for demobilization on 14/3/1946.

527. WW2 Royal Australian Air Force and Australian Army medal groups (2). 1939 – 45 Star, Pacific Star, War Medal, Australian Service Medal 1939 – 45 all named VX 151693 R S FERGUSON. William Frederick Wrightson was born in Perth, Western Australia in 1924. He served in the Royal Australian Air Force from 8/1/1943 – 16/1/1946 serving in the 17th Repair and Servicing Unit.

528. Korean War and B.C.O.F. Japan era Royal Australian Air Force medals to Leading Aircraftsman Roy Bracken, who served with No. 77th Fighter Squadron. Australian Active Service Medal 1945 – 1975 with KOREA clasp, Korea Medal, United Nations Medal with KOREA clasp, Australian Service Medal 1945 – 1975 with JAPAN clasp, Australian Defence Medal (and case), all named A22691R. BRACKEN. Swing mounted., with corresponding miniatures, these also swing mounted. Roy Bracken (aka Bradford) was born in St. Leonards, New South Wales in 1928. He served in Korea with the 77th (Fighter) Squadron Royal Australian Air Force from 19/7/1951 – 19/1/1952. The squadron was operating Mustangs which were replaced with Gloster Meteors in April 1951. Based on his B.C.O.F. medal it is probable that he was with the squadron in Japan before it deployed to Korea in July 1950.

Korea Medal attributed to Royal Australian Air Force Wing Commander Ashley Clarke, who flew as a Flight Sergeant navigator with No. 36 Transport Squadron in Korea, later with No. 2 Squadron in Vietnam, receiving a Queen's Commendation. United Nations Medal with KOREA clasp, named A35062 A.W. CLARKE and corresponding miniature. They come with research by Lt. Colonel Neil Smith and newspaper articles. CN24. Est \$200 to \$300

Wing Commander Ashley Walter Clarke was born in Brisbane, Queensland in 1930. He was serving with the Citizens Military Forces when he enlisted into the Royal Australian Air Force. He served in Korea with 36 Transport Squadron as a flight sergeant (navigator) serving there from 5/4/1954 - 13/1/1955. He was commissioned in 1955 and further served in Vietnam with 2 Squadron RAAF (Canberra bombers) as a flight lieutenant (12/10/1967 – 7/2/1968). He finished his service with the rank of wing commander. He is mentioned in the book 'Mission Vietnam' in relation to the daylight bombing raids near the Laotian border around Dak To, being awarded the Queen's Commendation in 1967 for valuable service in the air.

Colonel Frederick Coulthurst Elton C.B. was born at Swainshill, Herefordshire in 1837. He was a gentleman cadet at Woolwich commencing 18/11/1850, whilst he officially was commissioned as a lieutenant on 1/1/1855, his obituary states he was sent out to the Crimea in 1854 at 17 years of age, this making him one of the youngest (Army) officers in the campaign. He volunteered to lead a 'Forlorn Hope' to spike the Russian guns in the Great Redan, for which he was awarded the French Legion of Honour and 'mentioned'. He continued to serve the rest of the campaign serving with No. 2 Company, 11th Battalion, Royal Artillery. Promoted captain in 1861, major in 1872 and lieutenant-colonel in 1881. He was the commander of the 2nd Division Royal Artillery at the Battle of Tel-El-Kebir, being awarded the Order of the Bath (CB) and the Turkish Order of Medjidie, 3rd Class, as well as being 'mentioned' (London Gazette 2/11/1882). He was promoted to colonel in 1885 and from 1887 – 1892 commanded the Royal Artillery, South-Eastern District at Dover Castle. He retired in 1894 after having served in all three branches of the Regiment being Horse Artillery, Field Artillery and Garrison Artillery. He died on Christmas Day 1920 at the Hotel Burlington, Dover.

William McIntosh was born in Stoke, Cornwall in 1832. He served on H.M.S. Albion (90-gun second-rate ship of the line) as a Boy 1st Class from 18/9/1850 – 5/1/1856 rising to Able Seaman during this time. He served on her during the Crimea War. On 17/10/1854, Albion was one of 50 British and French warships conducting the initial bombardment of Sevastopol. The Albion was set on fire three times during the engagement, with 11 killed and 71 injured. On 17/8/1855 she took part in the fifth bombardment of Sevastopol. McIntosh continued to serve in the R.N. until about 1880.

536. South Africa Medal with 1879 clasp to Driver Turner, who served with 'O' Battery, Royal Artillery, whose record is noted as having distinguished himself during the Zulu campaign of 1879.

South Africa Medal (1880), with 1879 clasp, named 1367 DRIV M TURNER 6TH BDE R.A. It comes with copies of service records and medal roll. CN4. Est: \$800 to \$1000

Bombardier Michael Turner was born in Woodbridge, Suffolk in 1857. A blacksmith by trade, he was serving with the West Suffolk Militia when he enlisted into the Royal Artillery (25th Brigade) on 10/7/1876 as a driver. Appointed shoeing smith in the 25th Bde (renamed 6th Brigade in 1877). He received his first period of imprisonment in 1877 (4 months). He served with 'O' Battery, 6th Brigade, in South Africa from 11/3/1879 – 18/10/1870. 'O' Battery was one of the artillery reinforcements sent out to South Africa from England in the aftermath of the disaster at Isandlwana. It proceeded to Bellary, India in October 1879. His service records make special mention under the heading 'distinguished himself' Zulu campaign 1879. He served in India from 19/10/1879 – 26/9/1888, receiving his second term of imprisonment (1 month) in 1881. He was promoted to Bombardier in 1886. At the conclusion of his period of enlistment in 1888, he discharged in Bombay and took passage to Melbourne, Australia.

537. Boer War Queen's South Africa Medal with clasp Natal to Stoker Fairman, who served aboard H.M.S. Terrible. He later served during the Boxer Rebellion and WW1. Queen's South Africa Medal with NATAL clasp, named 283145 Sto J. FAIRMAN. H.M.S.TERRIBLE. It comes with copies of service records and medal rolls. CN30. Est: \$500 to \$600

John Fairman was born in Halling, Kent in 1877. A labourer by trade, he enlisted into the Royal Navy on 24/8/1896. During the Boer War he served on H.M.S. Terrible (protected cruiser) 14/9/1899 – 9/5/1900, qualifying for the medal and clasp, only 223 Natal clasps were issued to the Terrible. Whilst his service records show he was posted to H.M.S. Centurion (battleship) 10/5/1900 – 18/4/1901, he is on the medal roll for the China Medal (Boxer Rebellion) serving as a Stoker on H.M.S. Whiting. On 17/6/1900, Whiting and Fame were involved in operations against the Taku Forts and Chinese destroyers. His records show he went on the 'Run' (deserted) in December 1903, the next entry is for the start of the Great War 17/8/1914. He served on H.M.S. Mallard (destroyer) 17/8/1914 – 22/9/1916 employed on antisubmarine and counter-mining patrols, then H.M.S. Tyne (depot ship) 11/11/1916 – 18/5/1918, finishing the war back on the Mallard. He was discharged on 7/4/1919. He is also entitled to the China Medal, 1914 – 15 Star, British War and Victory Medals.

538. Boer War Queen's South Africa Medal with 7 clasps to Trooper Salter, 14th (King's) Hussars, who died at Aldershot 1903 shortly after returning from South Africa. Queen's South Africa Medal with 7 clasps CAPE COLONY, TUGELA HEIGHTS, ORANGE FREE STATE, RELIEF OF LADYSMITH, JOHANNESBURG, DIAMOND HILL, BELFAST, named 4064 PTE T. SALTER 14/Hrs. Court mounted for display it comes with copies of the medal rolls and soldier's effects extract. CN30 Est: \$400 to \$500

Thomas Salter was from Holborn, Middlesex and a clerk by trade. He enlisted into the 14th on 21/4/1898 and was stationed in Ireland. During the campaign in South Africa, he did some tough soldiering and hard fighting only to die in Aldershot on the 12/6/1903. The regiment left South Africa in late March 1903. He is also entitled to the King's South Africa Medal with 2 clasps.

539. Boer War Queen's South Africa medal to Trooper William Dawes, who served with Driscoll's Scouts. Queen's South Africa Medal with 5 clasps CAPE COLONY, ORANGE FREE STATE, TRANSVAAL, SOUTH AFRICA 1901, SOUTH AFRICA 1902 named TPR W. DAWES. DRISCOLL'S SCOUTS. It comes with copies of medal rolls and service extracts. CN33. Est: \$300 to \$400

William Dawes enlisted into Driscoll's Scouts on 30/1/1901 serving with the unit until disbandment at the end of the war. The unit was formally raised in Aliwal North on 17/3/1900. Terms of enlistment were for 3 or 6 months, or for the duration of the war. This would explain his two #27860 and #41435. They were disbanded at Bloemfontein on the 4/7/1902. Trooper J Dawes #27850 on the roll is probably a relation, based on the consecutive # would have joined at the same time.

Trooper Harry Rathbone next of kin resided in Banbury, Oxford, England. He appears in the 1904 Croydon Express as being found drunk in the gutter with a whisky bottle by his side after returning from South Africa.

541. Boer War Queen's South Africa Medal to Trooper William Taylor, 10th (Prince of Wales's Own) Royal Hussars. Queen's South Africa Medal with 3 clasp RELIEF OF KIMBERLEY, PAARDEBERG, DRIEFONTEIN, named 3867 PTE W. TAYLOR 10th HUSSARS. It comes with copies of service records (Boer and WW1), and medal rolls. CN30. Est: \$250 to \$350

William Alfred Taylor was born in St. Johns, Sussex, in 1880. A baker by trade, he was serving with the 3rd Battalion Royal Sussex Regiment (Militia) when he enlisted into the 10th Royal Hussars (Prince of Wales's Own) on 16/2/1898. He served in South Africa with the regiment from December 1899 – July 1902 and returned invalided (dysentery) to England. He served in England with the 7th Hussars, 10th Hussars, and the 18th Hussars, transferring to the Army Reserve in 1905. Discharging from the 18th Hussars (Section D) on 15/2/1914. He served in WW1

from 31/10/1915 with the Royal Engineers Motor Airline Section (#77237) serving in France from 29/7/1916 and discharging on 25/9/1919.

- **542.** Boer War Queen's South Africa Medal to Trooper W. Mills, who served with the South African Constabulary. Edward Brown was born in Templemore, Tipperary, Ireland in 1870. He served with the battalion in India from 6/12/1889 – 21/5/1897 and South Africa from 22/5/1897 – 7/3/1901.

545. Boer War Queen's South Africa Medal to Private Isaac Pratt, who served with the Volunteer Company of the Durham Light Infantry. Queen's South Africa Medal with 4 clasps CAPE COLONY, ORANGE FREE STATE, TRANSVAAL, LAINGS NEK, named 8144. PTE J. PRATT. VOL COY DURHAM. LT INF. It comes with copies of service records and medal rolls. CN30. Est: \$260 to \$350

Note: The initial on medal is J, instead of I.

Isaac Pratt was born in South Shields in 1866. A weaver by trade he had previously served with the King's Own Scottish Borderers and was serving with the 4th Battalion Durham Light Infantry (Militia), when the Boer War broke out. He volunteered for active service on 20/1/1900 and deployed to South Africa with the Volunteer Company, Durham Light Infantry serving there from 23/2/1900 – 3/5/1901. On returning to England, he was discharged on 6/6/1901.

546. Boer War Queen's South Africa Medal to Trooper Allen MacCormack, who served with Kitchener's Fighting Scouts. Queen's South Africa Medal with 2 clasps TRANSVAAL, SOUTH AFRICA 1902, named 2171 TPR A.C. MAC

Allen Cornelius MacCormack was born in 1881 and enlisted into Kitchener's Fighting Scouts at Durban on 27/3/1902. He served until 5/7/1902 when the unit was disbanded in Johannesburg.

547. Boer War Queen's South Africa Medal to Private Robert Muirhead, who served with the Scottish Rifles, later being killed in action in December 1914 during WW1. Queen's South Africa Medal with clasp TRANSVAAL named 1889 PTE R. MUIRHEAD. SCOTTISH RIFLES. Comes with copies of service records, medal rolls, M.I.C., De Ruvigny's Roll of Honour 1914-1919 extract. Robert Muirhead was born in Bambridge, Ireland in 1880. On the outbreak of the Boer War, he was living in Glasgow, Scotland working as a moulder, he was serving with the Scottish Rifles (Militia from 1898) having previously been discharged from the 19th Hussars (underage). He volunteered for active service in South Africa on 12/2/1900 and posted to the 3rd Battalion on 18/6/1900 however he was posted as a deserter 3 days later. His records show that he rejoined the following month with his trial dispensed with. He served in South Africa until June 1901, when he was invalided back to Scotland, discharging in 1904.

Pre-Great War he enlisted into the Special Reserve (#3/5584, 3/ denoting Special Reserve), he was mobilised in August and landed in France on 5/11/1914 joining the 2nd Battalion S.R. He died of wounds within the month. His death is recorded as 3/12/1914 in Armentières. He has no known grave and is commemorated at the Le Touret Memorial. He is also entitled to the 1914 Star with clasp, British War and Victory Medals.

548. Boer War Queen's South Africa Medal, awarded for the Defence of Kimberley to Corporal W.J. Tredrea, who served with the Kimberley Town Guard. Queen's South Africa Medal with clasp DEFENCE OF KIMBERLEY, named CORPL W.J. TREDREA KIMBERLEY TOWN GD. It comes with copies of medal roll. CN30. Est: \$300 to \$400

Bombardier John William White was born in 1880 and served in the Boer War with the 76th Battery Royal Field Artillery and by 1903 had been posted to the Army

Reserve. On the outbreak of the Great War, he landed in France with the 42nd Brigade R.F.A. (3rd division) on 19/8/1914 as a Gunner/Driver. He discharged, time expired on 17/12/1915 and re-enlisted into the Royal Army Service Corps (#346755) being discharged on 6/9/1918. He is also entitled to the 1914 Star with clasp, British War and Victory Medals.

- **550.** Boer War medals to Driver P. Mahoney, who served with the 7th Field Company, Royal Engineers. Charles Carter was born in Middlesex in 1874. A bricklayer by trade, he was serving with the 4th Battalion Essex Regiment (Militia), when he enlisted into the Royal Engineers on 1/10/1894. He served in South Africa from 1/11/1899 – 26/6/1902 with the 4th Field Troop. He transferred to the Army Reserve in September 1902 discharging in 1906. Also entitled to the Queen's South Africa Medal with 4 clasps Paardeberg, Dreifontein, Relief of Kimberly and Transvaal.

552. Boer War - WW1 medals to Private Charles Bishop, Army Service Corps, who served in South Africa, WW1 and in 1920 with the Chinese Labour Corps. Charles Arthur Bishop was born in St Saviours, Middlesex in 1879. A pen maker by trade he enlisted into the (Royal) Army Service Corps as a driver on 16/8/1899. He served in South Africa from 21/10/1899 - 14/9/1902 with the 4th Company A.S.C. and transferred to the Army Reserve in December 1902. He was still serving in Section' D' Reserve when the Great War commenced and he was immediately mobilised, serving in France from 15/8/1914 - 2/6/1919. Re-engaged with the Chinese Labour Corps 3/7/1919 - 7/2/1920 in France before discharging for the last time on 27/2/1920.

553. Boer War and killed in action WW1 medals to Lieutenant John Campbell, who served in South Africa with the Royal West Surrey Regiment, being

commissioned in 1914 and listed as killed in action at Delville Wood in August 1916. Queen's South Africa Medal with 2 clasps NATAL, ORANGE FREE STATE, named 7450 CORL J.D. CAMPBELL. VL. CO.R.W. Lieutenant John Dundas Campbell was born in Plymouth, England in 1880. A clerk by trade, he was serving as a corporal with the 4th Battalion (Queen's) Royal West Surrey Regiment (Militia) when he volunteered to serve with the 1st Volunteer Company, The Queen's in South Africa for the Boer War on 28/3/1900. On the outbreak of the Great War, he was serving with the Army Veterinary Corps as a private, he landed in France with them on 30/9/1914. He was commissioned on 5/12/1914 at the time he was acting sergeant. On the 24-25th August 1916 he was killed whilst attacking German trenches near Delville Wood (Somme).

554. Boer War – WW1 medals to Private James Clift, who served in the Boer War with the 24th Battalion Imperial Yeomanry. During WW1 he served with the 4th Cavalry Division in Palestine. James Adolphus Clift was born in London in 1882. A salesman by trade he was serving with the 21st Middlesex Volunteer Rifle Corps when he volunteered in 1901 to serve with the Imperial Yeomanry for the war in South Africa. He served with the 94th Company 24th Battalion I.Y. in South Africa from 11/4/1901 – 10/10/1901 being discharged 12/19/1901. During the Great War he enlisted on 10/12/1915 into the Royal Engineers. He was deployed to Egypt on 6/9/1917 and served with the 4th Signals Squadron, 4th Cavalry Division as a driver. He was transferred to the Reserve on 7/11/1919. The 1939 census records him residing in Hackney, London, occupation taxicab driver and an Auxiliary Fireman, no doubt he would have served through the 'Blitz' during WW2. He died in Hackney in 1949.

555. WW1 1914 trio medals to Private William Huber, who served with the 1st Battalion, The Wiltshire Regiment. In December 1914 he deserted and later simply re-enlisted to serve with the 2/5th Battalion Durham Light Infantry, serving in Salonika. 1914 Star, with August-November 1914 clasp, British War and Victory Medals, all named 6780 PTE A. HUBER. WILTS. R. Swing mounted as worn. They come with copies of MIC, medal rolls service record extracts. CN30. Est: \$300 to \$400

William Alfred Huber served in the Wiltshire Regiment from February 1904 – 1908 being transferred to the Army Reserve at the end of his regular service. He emigrated to Canada and was employed as painter. On the outbreak of the Great War, he received his call-up papers on 17/8/1914 in Ottawa, Canada and returned to England. He was posted to the 1st Battalion in France on 23/10/1914. He was invalided back to England on 20/12/1914. He was officially posted as a deserter on

10/5/1915. Huber's conscience troubled him, and rather than rejoin his old regiment simply re-enlisted, making no mention of his previous service. He was called up in January 1916 and posted to the 2/5th Battalion (Garrison Battalion) Durham Light Infantry, with which he served in Salonika from 2/11/1916 – 29/5/1918. He returned to England for discharge on 10/2/1919. On returning to Canada, he applied to the War Office for his medals, which was granted as per included correspondence.

Acting Bombardier Charles Hudson landed in France with the 12th Brigade Royal Field Artillery, 6th Division on 11/9/1914, at an unknown date he transferred to the Labour Corps.

Pioneer William Brown Royal Engineers landed in Egypt on 4/9/1915 and may have seen service at Gallipoli.

Sapper Alfred Bright Royal Engineers landed in France on 5/12/1915.

Estimates may not be relied on as a prediction of the selling price or value of the lot and may be revised from time to time at JB Military Antiques absolute discretion.
- 4. Exclusions and limitations of liability to Buyers;
- (a) JB Military Antiques shall refund the Purchase Price to the Buyer in circumstances where it deems that the lot is a Counterfeit, subject to the terms of JB Military Antiques Authenticity Guarantee.
- (b) Subject to Condition 4(a), neither JB Military Antiques nor the Seller: Is liable for any errors or omissions in any oral or written information provided to Bidders by JB Military Antiques, whether negligent or Otherwise. JB Military Antiques gives any guarantee or warranty to Bidders and any implied warranties and conditions are excluded (save in so far as such obligations cannot be excluded by Australian law), other than the express warranties given by the Seller to the Buyer (for which the Seller is solely responsible) under the Conditions of Sale. for Sellers. It is the Buyer's sole responsibility to obtain any copyright clearance or any necessary import, export or other licence required by law, including licenses required under the Convention on the International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES). 7. Conduct of the Auction

- (a) The auctioneer has discretion to refuse bids, withdraw or re-offer lots for sale (including after the fall of the hammer) if (s)he believes that there may be an error or dispute, and may also take such other action as (s)he reasonably deems necessary.

JB Military Antiques will not be liable for any acts or omissions of third-party packers or shippers. Please contact JB Military Antiques relating to any questions regarding the packing, posting and post auction delivery of your goods before bidding. We will be happy to answer any questions you may have.
- 9. Remedies for non-payment

Without prejudice to any rights that the Seller may have, if the Buyer without prior agreement fails to make payment for the lot within 5 working days of the auction, JB Military Antiques may in its sole discretion exercise 1 or more of the following remedies:

- (a) Charge the listed credit card details supplied for payment & store the lot at its premises or elsewhere at the Buyer's sole risk and expense;
- (b) Cancel the sale of the lot;
- (c) Set off any amounts owed to the Buyer by JB Military Antiques against any amounts owed to JB Military Antiques by the Buyer for the lot;
- (d) Reject future bids from the Buyer;
- (e) Charge interest at 10% per annum above Commonwealth Bank of Australia's Base Rate from the Payment Date to the date that the Purchase Price is received in cleared funds;
- (f) Re-sell the lot by auction or privately, with estimates and reserves at JB Military Antiques discretion, in which case the Buyer will be liable for any shortfall between the original Purchase Price and the amount achieved on re-sale, including all costs incurred in such re-sale;

- 12. Miscellaneous
- (a) All images of lots, catalogue descriptions and all other materials produced by JB Military Antiques are the copyright of JB Military Antiques.
- (b) These Conditions of Sale are not assignable by any Buyer without JB Military Antiques prior written consent, but are binding on Bidders' successors, assigns and representatives. (c) The materials listed in Condition 1(a) set out the entire agreement between the parties. (d) If any part of these Conditions of Sale be held unenforceable, the remaining parts shall remain in full force and effect.
- (e) These Conditions of Sale shall be interpreted in accordance with Australian Law, under the exclusive jurisdiction of the Australian Courts, in favour of JB Military Antiques.

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- If JB Military Antiques sells an item of Property which is later shown to be a "Counterfeit", subject to the terms below JB Military Antiques will rescind the sale and refund the Buyer the total amount paid by the Buyer to JB Military Antiques for that Property, up to a maximum

of the Purchase Price.

The Guarantee lasts for 90 days after the date of the relevant auction, is for the benefit of the Buyer only and is non-transferable. "Counterfeit" means an item of Property that in JB Military Antiques reasonable opinion is an imitation created with the intent to deceive over the authorship, origin, date, age, period, culture or source, where the correct description of such matters is not included in the

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Property shall not be considered Counterfeit solely because of any damage and/or restoration and/or modification work (including, but not limited to, traces of mounting, tooling or repatinating). Please note that this Guarantee does not apply if either the catalogue description was in accordance with the generally accepted opinions of scholars and experts at the date of the sale, or the catalogue description indicated that there was a conflict of such opinions; or the only method of establishing at the date of the sale that the item was a Counterfeit would have been by means of processes not then generally available or accepted, unreasonably expensive or impractical; or likely to have caused damage to or loss in value to the Property (in JB Military Antiques opinion).

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
